Author Guidelines for Manuscript Submission

Authors are requested to read the guidelines below in preparing the manuscript.

Introduction

The Sri Lanka Journal of Human Rights is a peer-reviewed journal, which publishes original research articles from the following theme open for all academia, graduates, undergraduates, and researchers. The review committee consists of academics and practitioners with expertise in the relevant theme. The CSHR adopts a double anonymous review process to ensure that the quality of the publications with protected from plagiarism.

Theme: Challenges to Democracy, Governance, and Human Rights

GENERAL INFORMATION: Read the guidelines below in preparing the full paper based on the given template. Please refer to the attached template to prepare the full paper which has already specified different components of the articles (title, text, etc.,) Do not change the characters, fonts, symbols, etc., in the given format when preparing the manuscript. All the manuscripts must be in English. The preferred spelling of the manuscripts is British English. Author/s must send the dully filled Author Declaration https://cshr.cmb.ac.lk/sri-lanka-journal-of-human-rights/ with the manuscript. Detailed guidelines have been given below and authors are responsible for understanding these guidelines before submitting their manuscripts. Important points to Author/s

- 1. Submission should be in MS Word format, Times New Roman font, size 12, single-spaced, page margin: 1.5".
- 2. All contributions should be in English; Word Count: 3000-4000
- 3. **Book and Movie Reviews:** 1500 words
- 4. Page numbers should be inserted at the bottom-middle of the page.
- 5. The abstract should include 6 keywords References: follow the OSCOLA referencing style and submit a list of references (use recent references instead of many outdated references).
- 6. The final decision regarding the publication will be taken by the Advisory Board
- 7. Critically evaluate the literature published internationally in reputed journals that publish relevant studies from which you can find a gap.
- 8. The paper must make it clear about the theory it is addressing.

TITLE PAGE: The title of the paper should be concise, informative, and meaningful. Please avoid the use of long systemic names and non-standard abbreviations, acronyms, or symbols in the title.

AUTHORS AND AFFILIATION: If the publication is from several authors, list the names of all the authors first, followed by their affiliation. Use superscript numeric identifiers to link the authors with their affiliations. Include email addresses with affiliation. Indicate the email address of the corresponding author (please refer to the template: https://cshr.cmb.ac.lk/srilanka-journal-of-human-rights/).

KEY POINTS TO AUTHORS: The following points have to be followed by the authors in preparing the manuscript:

- 1. Utilize recent references rather than relying on outdated ones.
- 2. Highlight the identified research gap and its significance for both local and international researchers.
- 3. Evaluate literature from reputable national and international journals to identify any gaps in existing research.
- 4. Clearly state the theory being addressed, whether it involves testing, generating, or applying theories, and discuss relevant theoretical factors.

5. In the discussion and conclusion, refer back to the literature review to demonstrate how the research question was derived and how the study extends current understanding of relevant issues.

ABSTRACT: Abstract should consist of concise information of the content of the article and shall be informative, accessible and state the main results obtained. It shall be a summary of the research findings with objectives, a brief methodology, major findings and conclusions and shall not contain table numbers, figure numbers, references or equations and shall not exceed 300 words.

KEYWORDS: Keywords should appear immediately after the abstract and provide a maximum of 6 separated by a comma.

INTRODUCTION: Introduction shall be concise describing the nature of the research problem concerned with its background. All relevant references shall be cited and all the highly specialized terms should be expanded indicating all abbreviations used in the article.

METHODOLOGY: The methods used in the research shall be described in terms of qualitative or quantitative techniques or otherwise. The methodology has to be described clearly providing sufficient details of the research design, simulation techniques, statistical tests or analyses carried out to generate the results so as to allow the methodology to be repeated by other researchers.

RESULTS: Describe the details of the major findings and the outcomes of the study in the results section. Use tables to improve clarity and express results using graphs, statistical diagrams wherever relevant.

TABLES: Submit the tables of the publication as editable text and/or as images. Incorporate the tables in the relevant places of the body text. Table shall be numbered consecutively in accordance with their appearance. The table title shall appear on the top of the table with any explanatory captions below the title. The citation should be mentioned in the below table.

FIGURES: Figure title has to appear at the top of the figure. All Figures including maps, photographs, and plates shall be numbered in the relevant sequence and their title has to appear at the top. Figures, graphics, plates, photographs, and maps shall have approximately 300 dpi with embedded fonts and have to be inserted in the relevant place of the text. The citation should be mentioned in the below the figures.

DISCUSSION: This section shall include a discussion of the significance of the results and compare the findings of previous researchers using relevant references.

CONCLUSION: Conclusions drawn from the research should be summarized with recommendations for future research.

APPENDICES: If it is needed, the appendices shall appear after the conclusion. If there are multiple Appendices they have to be labeled as Appendix A, B, C, and D, etc.

REFERENCES: Ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list. If these references are included in the reference list, they should follow the OSCOLA referencing style which is the standard reference style of the journal.

WORD COUNT: The word count of the abstract shall be a maximum of 300 words and the total word count of the manuscript excluding references shall be 3000 to 4000 words.
